NASHVILLE STEAM PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Members, Donors, Sponsors, Volunteers and Friends,

We are pleased to present the Nashville Steam Preservation Society's (NSPS) 2021 Annual Report. During 2021 we were able to schedule volunteer work sessions again, unlike most of the previous year due to the pandemic. We sustained significant storm damage to our shop in March of 2021, but this didn't stop our crews from making good progress on the restoration of 576. Thank you to everyone who responded quickly to the storm damage and donated to our emergency relief fund. Contributions remained strong due to several successful fundraising campaigns including a variety of private and public grants, a matching grant opportunity, and support through in-kind services.

In 2021, NSPS crews were able to complete tender interior repair and painting, significant boiler work with the installation and welding in of 9 new boiler plates, more than 250 new rivets driven, all valve cages replaced and cylinders bored, numerous appliances restored, and most significantly was the removal of the locomotive's wheels and trucks for rebuilding. Thanks to project sponsors Clark Crane, John Bouchard & Sons Company, and the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum, our crews swiftly moved towards wheel and bearing work including the re-profiling of the front trailing truck wheel set, the renewal of all 4 engine truck wheels, and the replacement of all 8 driving wheel tires and the rear trailing truck wheelset's tires.

Throughout 2021, our volunteer family of dedicated individuals logged 5,010 hours of locomotive and component restoration, development of our education programming, fundraising and marketing strategy to meet our goals, and important administrative duties.

Financial support remained strong at just over \$442,000. Foundations contributed more than \$216,000 in unrestricted gifts, and gifts from individuals totaled over \$220,200. In-kind donations of services, tools, equipment, and materials from 29 corporations and 2 individuals helped grow our tool and equipment inventory as well as offset significant labor and professional services costs in 2021. More information about our generous sponsors is available on our website, along with details on sponsorship levels, opportunities, and programs.

Nashville Steam Company Store sales increased by an incredible 90% over 2020 and closed the year with \$31,810 in net income. Product lines grew to 20 categories with more than 268 individual products offered. New product development, increased awareness, and media coverage helped to drive sales through the website, social media and events. Additionally, NSPS is now a Case Knives dealer which has helped grow our market outreach and product lines. All proceeds from the Company Store support the restoration and future operation of the locomotive.

A matching grant opportunity was announced late 2021 by The Candelaria Fund and The Wick Moorman Charitable Trust that will fully match all donations of \$250 or more. To date, we have raised more than \$150,000 towards the goal of \$200,000! Your generous support is requested to help us reach this goal. We are very close - please consider helping us cross the finish line for this matching gift!

Our 2021 Open House was held in November at the Tennessee Central Railroad Museum where rivet demonstrations and restored components were displayed for our guests. Guests were able to interact with volunteers, ask questions, purchase gifts at our Company Store, and see the progress that has been made.

No. 576 will celebrate its 80th birthday in August of 2022! In honor of this milestone birthday, and in celebration of our beloved locomotive's restoration progress, we are asking for gifts of \$80 for No. 576's 80th birthday. Gifts of \$80 or more will be matched dollar for dollar for the last two weeks of August in celebration of No. 576's birthday. Please continue to help us steam the stripe!

2021 was a productive year that would not have been possible without our generous and growing number of supporters. For so many of you that have donated this year or last, thank you. 
