2024 was an incredible year for the Nashville Steam Preservation Society, bringing us closer than ever to completing the restoration of Locomotive No. 576. We look forward to the day when both Nashville residents and visitors can step aboard this historic gem and experience the golden era of steam travel with us.

In the enclosed 2024 Annual Report, you'll find our Financial Report, Restoration Budget, and a Donor Roll recognizing both individual and corporate supporters. You'll also see a list of generous in-kind contributions from various organizations, as well as the volunteer hours logged — both on-site and behind the scenes — to keep our project moving forward. A heartfelt thank you to our generous donors. Your support has made it possible for us to continue working tirelessly on this one-of-a-kind restoration. Your contributions have brought us this far, and we're thrilled for the journey ahead.

This past year, our dedicated team of volunteers logged an impressive 8,875 hours across a range of efforts, locomotive and component restoration, the development of educational programming, fundraising and marketing strategies, managing our company store, and handling essential administrative tasks to help us achieve our goals. We cannot overstate the importance of our volunteers—this progress wouldn't be possible without their unwavering commitment and hard work!

Last year, our restoration highlights included:

- Ordering all required boiler tubes
- Installing the last remaining staybolt sleeves
- Driving the final boiler rivets
- Completing restoration of the power reverse, marking the completion of all of No. 576's appliances
- Beginning the tender truck overhaul and roller bearing conversion
- Sandblasting and priming the tender
- Beginning fabrication of new running boards

Meanwhile, our Company Store team developed and launched 15 products, and our Education Team introduced the Junior Engineer Club, a new initiative promoting STEM education and railroad history to local Nashville youth.

We're deeply grateful for everything you've done for us so far, and we'd be truly honored if you'd consider continuing your support. As the completion of the locomotive nears, we'll have several, new critical projects to take on. At NSPS, we're proud to put your investment to work where it matters most — 82% goes directly to restoration efforts, while the remaining 18% supports the behind-the-scenes work that makes it all possible. Once again, thank you for your incredible support.



LOCOMOTIVE & TENDER ESTIMATES*

Boiler and Steam Pipe: \$139,000 Appliances: \$51,000

Tender Trucks and Wheels: **\$24,000** Locomotive Wheels and Rods: **\$4,000**

Frame, Spring Rigging, and Brake Rigging: \$16,000

ANCILLARY EXPENSES**

Miscellaneous Consumables: \$10,000 Rental and Equipment Purchase \$10,000

*Year over year costs for materials have increased. This estimate may vary depending on supplies availability and increased costs for materials. Included in estimates are for labor of skilled and experienced contractors and material. Volunteer labor could potentially reduce the total labor cost by 20% or more. Project time frame remaining estimated at .8 to 1 year to completion. Timeframe could potentially be reduced with an increase of outsourcing and cost by as much as 20% of total estimate.

**Other expenses, such as facility rental, utilities, administration, and insurance are not included in these estimates, and may add an additional \$100,000 to the operating budget throughout the restoration project.


